Pier 54: Hudson River Park. across from W 13th Street

The survivors of the Titanic, a ship owned by White Star Line, were rescued by the ship Carpathia, owned by the Cunard Line. White Star owned Pier 59 in Manhattan, which was meant to be the Titanic's destination, while Cunard owned Pier 54, which is where the survivors were eventually brought ashore.

In 1934, Cunard and White Star Lines merged, and those words (now faded) can still be seen at the entrance to Pier 54 today, though it now no longer serves as a dock for ships. Instead, it exists as a landmark near the entrance to Little Island. White Star's Pier 59 today is a golf course.

Jane Hotel: 113 Jane Street

Originally founded as the American Seamen's Friend Society Sailor's Home and Institute in 1908, this building was a hotel and resource for sailors while on land. Just across the street from Pier 54 where the Titanic arrived, the Home opened its doors to provide food and lodging to the surviving crew and some of the passengers. They were welcomed to stay until the end of the American Inquiry into the ship's sinking, and the crew held a memorial service there four days after they arrived.

Throughout the years, the building has been a YMCA, a hub for performances and the music scene, and finally, a hotel. Today, the Jane Hotel has rooms available to book, many in the style of ship's cabins, in honor of its nautical roots.

HISTOR The tragedy of the Titanic has been a cultural fascination since its fateful voyage over 100 years ago. The story of the "unsinkable" ship has been retold in dozens of movies, books, television specials, and of course, musicals. The first movie about the Titanic came out in May of 1912, less than a month after the survivors were rescued, and the most recent movie came out earlier this year. Arguably the height of Titanic's cultural zeitgeist was 1997, when both the Tony-winning musical by Maury Yeston and Peter Stone and the Oscarwinning movie by James Cameron premiered.

BACKIARD New York City itself is inextricably linked to the story of the Titanic, and the historical ripples left in the wake of its demise. It was the original destination of the ship when it set sail from Queenstown, Ireland, and also the actual destination of the survivors after they were rescued by the ship Carpathia. Of the 2,240 passengers and crew on board (almost the same number of seats in City Center's theater) only 706 survived to arrive in New York City. Today, many locations related to or commemorating the history of the Titanic are not only intact, but also can be visited TES IN NEW YOR not far from City Center.

Ida and Isidor Straus Monument: Straus Park, at Broadway and W 106th Street

Passengers Ida and Isidor Straus were a married couple returning home from a European trip on the Titanic. Isidor was a co-owner of Macy's Department Store, and the Strauses were known throughout New York City as generous philanthropists. When news of their fate reached the city, thousands of mourners came to their memorial service, and in 1912, the City of New York named a park after the couple, who had lived about a block away.

As several survivors recounted, when the ship was sinking, officers encouraged Ida to join the women and children in a lifeboat, but she chose to stay behind with her husband, allegedly saying, "We have lived together for many years. Where you go, I go." Their last moments are one of the most famous true love stories from the ship, and their story has been depicted in various television, film, and theatrical retellings including the Maury Yeston and Peter Stone musical.

She has conducted the Chicago Symphony, the Cincinnati Symphony, the Dallas Symphony, the Nashville Symphony, and was recently named an Imagination Artist for the Colorado Symphony. She is the Founder of Arts Ignite (artsignite.org) which recruits and trains high-level artists to teach young people health education and life skills through the arts. 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
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
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
