

booms and Sam follows, travelling even farther away from his family. The first global financial crisis, the Panic of 1857 occurs as a result of over-speculation in the railroad industry and the California Gold Rush. and tensions build until 1861 when the American Civil War begins.



The story in *Love Life* exists in two interlocking spirals. According to director **Victoria Clark**, "One spiral tells the story of the Cooper family and a marriage that is strained and eventually broken by the stresses of modern life, told through sketches that time-jump through American history. The other is the story of the American Dream and how it threatens to undermine us, told through a series of vaudeville acts that serve as sociopolitical commentary." Kurt Weill and Alan Jay Lerner place each sketch in the Cooper family's timeline in a specific, pivotal moment in American history that impacts Sam and Susan's marriage, as outlined below. The members of the Cooper family do not age as time moves on, and this production begins and ends in "the present."

# VOTES FOR WOMEN

The National American Woman Suffrage Association (NAWSA) forms in 1890. We hear Susan and her local branch organizing in "Women's Club Blues." Meanwhile, Sam is exhausted from his job and the economic downturn caused by the Panic of 1893.

# IN THE SHADOW OF THE GREAT DEPRESSION

Prohibition has been in effect since 1920. Sam and Susan go to international waters to celebrate New Year's Eve and indulge "legally." The party keeps going despite underlying issues and unrest both for the economy and the Coopers' marriage. The Great Depression looms just two years away.



# 1948 – NOW



Sam and Susan now live in New York City, contemporary to the time and place of *Love Life*'s original run. Americans must adjust to post-war economic and lifestyle change. During the war, many women went to work, and when the men return, everyone struggles to adjust their expectations.

Susan works outside the home at a department store, and Sam works in advertising. Though the family comes together to listen to the radio at the end of the day, they have grown further apart than ever.

Lerner probably could not have predicted that he would, in his own words, "become everything I satirized in that show"—he married a total of eight times. Lerner and Weill also couldn't have predicted that a major Recession would begin in November of 1948, just months after the show opened.

# LOVE and LIFE: In Search of the American Dream

Encores! Love Life speaks to America, five years after shutdown



Excerpts from a conversation between Victoria Clark (Director) and Rob Berman (Guest Music Director)

VICTORIA CLARK: As I approach the piece now, I feel more drawn than ever to the Coopers' story. I don't see them as just symbolic figures; they are flesh and blood people living in the present day. Weill and Lerner challenge us to see both *life* and *love* as full of nuance; living and loving both require work. How have you changed your thinking, Rob? What do you admire about the score?

**ROB BERMAN:** In writing a "vaudeville," Weill drew on so many American idioms: a soft-shoe, a blues, a Tin Pan Alley number, a hoedown, a torch song, and so on. Yet none of it feels generic or pastiche. Things don't go where you think they are going and there are musical surprises at every turn.

The score contains heartfelt sentiment, savvy showmanship, and biting satire. It's easy to see how it influenced theater artists such as Kander and Ebb or Hal Prince. It's smart, has a strong point of view, and makes the most of that quintessential American invention, "show-biz." What speaks to you about the book?

VICTORIA CLARK: This piece is deeply insightful about marriage, family, our country, and the skill it takes to communicate. Love Life exposes in both serious and comic ways how Americans are lured by the shinier thing, and how our own greed and egos take us farther and farther away from the simple act of listening to one another and tending our relationships. This production gives us an opportunity to explore what it means to be an American, from the vantage of our own diverse backgrounds and stories. How big are our hearts and minds? Big enough to hold all our diversity-race, ideology, culture, class, history? As Americans, how do we weather change, as we are buffeted by social, economic, cultural, environmental, political, technological, and human influences? Like Sam and Susan, can we find a way to talk to each other?



KURT WEILL (Music & Lyrics, Orchestrations & Arrangements) (1900 – 1950) began his career in the early 1920s in Berlin after studying in Busoni's master class. By the time his first opera, The Protagonist (Georg Kaiser), was performed to great acclaim in April 1926, he was an established young composer, but he had already decided to devote himself to the musical theater. His works with Bertolt Brecht soon made him the leading theater composer of his generation, particularly with the stunning success of The Threepenny Opera (1928) and the opera Mahagonny. He and his estranged wife Lotte Lenya fled the new Nazi regime in March 1933 and continued his indefatigable efforts, first in Paris (1933-35) with The Seven Deadly Sins. Arriving in New York in 1935 for The Eternal Road directed by Max Reinhardt, repeated postponements prompted him to stay. He first worked with the left-wing collectives of the Group Theatre and the Playrwights Company, before breaking into mainstream Broadway with Lady in the Dark (Moss Hart and Ira Gershwin, 1941), One Touch of Venus (SJ Perelman and Ogden Nash), Street Scene (Elmer Rice and Langston Hughes, 1947), and finally Lost in the Stars (Maxwell Anderson, 1949). Before his death at age 50, he was honored with the first Tony Award for outstanding score of a musical.

ALAN JAY LERNER (Book, Music & Lyrics) (1918 - 1986) wrote some of the American theater's most memorable musicals. He was born in New York City in 1918 and attended Choate and Harvard. With Frederick Loewe, he had his first Broadway hit in 1947 with Brigadoon. The following year, teaming up with established veteran Kurt Weill, Lerner had his second success with Love Life. Resuming his partnership with Loewe, the pair had their next hit in 1951 with Paint Your Wagon. In 1956, My Fair Lady opened on Broadway. Often called the "perfect musical," the show ran for 2,717 performances and the cast album sold more than five million copies. Lerner & Loewe's 1958 film musical, Gigi, won nine Academy awards and in 1960 came the last great success of their partnership, Camelot, starring Richard Burton and Julie Andrews. Lerner went on to collaborate with other composers including Burton Lane, Leonard Bernstein, and Andre Previn. He died in 1986 at the age of 67.
